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POLICIES AND PROCEDURES AGREEMENT 2012-2013

Listed below are the agreement statements and release statements for parents/guardians whose student(s) attends Eureka. Please carefully consider each one and signify your agreement to them by signing and dating this form.

1. We hereby agree to accept all regulations and policies at Eureka on the applicant's behalf.
2. We understand all students are accepted on a probationary basis.
3. We agree to uphold and support the standards of the school.
4. We agree to pay our financial obligations to Eureka on or before the 1st Wednesday of the month. Tuition is considered late after the 8th of each month. If not paid on time, we will pay the late-payment charge of \$25.00 per month. NOTE: A family whose account is in arrears at the end of the month may have their student removed from the class until the account is made current.
5. We agree to provide necessary supplies (textbooks, school supplies, etc.)
6. We understand that if parents cannot be reached in case of an emergency, or if a life-threatening emergency exists, we authorize Eureka personnel to seek or provide transportation, and to consent to emergency treatment as necessary in the opinion of a paramedic, licensed physician or dentist.
7. We understand that parents must inform Eureka of any medication given to their child while on campus (over-the-counter and prescription) and that medication must remain with Eureka staff and be administered by Eureka personnel who are authorized by a medical authorization form, which must be renewed each school year and on file in the office. No exceptions allowed.
8. We hereby agree to authorize Eureka's personnel to apply the appropriate discipline as outlined in the Eureka discipline policy in the Parent/Student Handbook.
9. We understand that Eureka reserves the right to dismiss any student who does not respect the standards or cooperate fully in the educational process. Students may also be dismissed should the parents and the administration reach an impasse regarding any policies, procedures, philosophy, or discipline measures.
10. We give permission for our child/children to take part in all school activities. We understand that the information submitted on this application will be used for student releases and emergencies, and for other informational purposes.
11. We understand that unless precluded by a current court order on file in with Eureka, either one and/or both parents will be notified of school activities and student releases.
12. We understand that tuition is based on a 70 day year. Fees are NOT refundable due to sickness, vacation, change of plans, or other reasons. Families may elect to pay annually or monthly or daily with varying discounts for each.

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ACCEPTABLE USE INTERNET POLICY page 1 of 2

The aim of this Acceptable Use Policy is to ensure that pupils will benefit from learning opportunities offered by Eureka's Internet resources in a safe and effective manner. Internet use and access is considered a resource and privilege. Therefore, if the AUP (Acceptable Use Policy) is not adhered to this privilege will be withdrawn and appropriate sanctions – as outlined in the AUP – will be imposed.

Eureka's Safe Internet Use Strategy

Eureka employs a number of strategies in order to maximize learning opportunities and reduce risks associated with the Internet. These strategies are as follows:

General

- Internet sessions will always be supervised by a teacher.
- Filtering software and/or equivalent systems are used on Eureka computers in order to minimize the risk of exposure to inappropriate material.
- Eureka will regularly monitor pupils' Internet usage.
- Students and teachers will be provided with training in the area of Internet safety.
- Uploading and downloading of non-approved software will not be permitted.
- Virus protection software will be used and updated on a regular basis.
- The use of personal floppy disks, memory sticks, CD-ROMs, or other digital storage media in school requires a teacher's permission.
- Students will treat others with respect at all times and will not undertake any actions that may bring Eureka into disrepute.

WORLD WIDE WEB

- Students will not intentionally visit Internet sites that contain obscene, illegal, hateful or otherwise objectionable materials.
- Students will report accidental accessing of inappropriate materials in accordance with school procedures.
- Students will use the Internet for educational purposes only.
- Students will not copy information into assignments and fail to acknowledge the source (plagiarism and copyright infringement).
- Students will never disclose or publicize personal information.

Email

- Pupils will be given the opportunity to publish projects, artwork or school work on the World Wide Web in accordance with clear policies and approval processes regarding the content that can be loaded to Eureka's website

- The publication of student work will be coordinated by a teacher.

CONSEQUENCES

Students who misbehave will be reminded to get back on track and may need further consequences as follows:

- Warning - no consequence
- Consequence (time-out, loss of recess, etc.)
- Consequence + phone call to parent

Chronic problems in a day or severely disruptive behavior will result in a visit with the administrator and/or parents being called.

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STATEMENT OF FAITH

Eureka is a conservative, evangelical, Bible-believing organization. Since we offer Bible instruction, corporate worship, and ministry opportunities in Jesus' name, you may read the following statement of faith to become familiar with where we stand on matters of faith and doctrine. While we will not be teaching doctrines specific to any church denomination, we do hold to these truths from Scripture:

1. We believe the Bible to be the inspired, the only infallible, authoritative, inerrant Word of God (2 Timothy 3:16, 2 Peter 1:21).
2. We believe there is one God, eternally existent in three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Genesis 1:1, Matthew 28:19, John 10:30).
3. We believe in the deity of Christ (John 10:33),
His virgin birth (Isaiah 7:14, Matthew 1:23, Luke 1:35),
His sinless life (Hebrews 4: 15, 7:26), His miracles (John 2:11),
His vicarious and atoning death (1 Corinthians 15:3, Ephesians 1:7, Hebrews 2:9),
His Resurrection (John 11:25, 1 Corinthians 15:4),
His Ascension to the right hand of God (Mark 16:19),
His personal return in power and glory (Acts 1:11, Revelation 19:11).
4. We believe in the absolute necessity of regeneration by the Holy Spirit for salvation because of the exceeding sinfulness of human nature and that men are justified on the single ground of faith in the shed blood of Christ and that only by God's grace and through faith alone are we saved (John 3:16–19, 5:24; Romans 3:23, 5:8–9; Ephesians 2:8–10; Titus 3:5).
5. We believe in the resurrection of both the saved and the lost; they that are saved unto the resurrection of life, and they that are lost unto the resurrection of condemnation (John 5:28–29).
6. We believe in the spiritual unity of believers in our Lord Jesus Christ (Romans 8:9, 1 Corinthians 2:12–13, Galatians 3:26–28).
7. We believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit by whose indwelling the Christian is enabled to live a godly life (Romans 8:13–14; 1 Corinthians 3:16, 6:19–20; Ephesians 4:30, 5:18).

At Eureka we understand that there may be slight denominational differences that are not in contrast to the above statements regarding issues and that are not salvational. While our teachers may speak to an issue if it arises in the course of a Bible devotional, we will not proclaim our personal view as doctrine, nor will we allow others to do so. Our desire is for the “spiritual unity of believers in our Lord Jesus Christ.” The core of our belief is the answer to the question Jesus asked Peter, “Who do you say that I am?”
